# The Glenn Stewart Memorial Invitational

This is a unique tournament in a couple of ways. First, it is a triples tournament where each player bowls four ends as lead, four ends as second, and four ends as skip in each of three 12-end games.

And it is unique in being named after a long-time member, Glenn Stewart, who liked to say he was "born on the green." In fact, he was born in the old Palo Alto Hospital that existed on the site for many years before the green was built.

The unique format is a particularly interesting and fun challenge and the tournament usually has more entrants than it can handle. This year the entry was down because it conflicted with the US Open in Arizona. Still, the level of competition was high, the last three games were all won by only 1 point, and each of the six teams won at least one game.

Two teams, Bud Birkenseer, Sam Hebert & Joy Guy, and John and Angie Peet bowling with Michelle Matthews, were undefeated after the first two games. The draw for the third game did not have them playing each other so there was an opportunity for other teams to be spoilers.

The club will hold our Annual Members Meeting on Saturday, December 14, 2019 at 11:00 am in the clubhouse. The meeting will follow the usual program — a review of the previous year, the election of Officers and Directors, the distribution of

trophies and awards for tournaments and contributions to the club, and, generally, have a good time while attending to the club's business.

This year we will also ask for approval on proposed changes to the Constitution and By-laws of the Palo Alto LBC. We are looking forward to seeing all of you.

It is a good time to renew old acquaintances, especially with those who we don't see as often as we would like.

Following the meeting there will be a festive holiday lunch, beginning at 12:30 pm. Of course, there will be bowling after the lunch, weather permitting.

While the slate of the proposed Officers and Directors was listed in the November issue of *Wicks*, we are happy to repeat the listing. The following individuals have been nominated:

Officers: President – John MacMorris; Vice President – Frank Matyskiela; Treasurer – Edward Hickey; Secretary – Kent Mather

*Directors* for 2020 and 2021 (2 year term): Peter Danner, Sam Hebert, and Lynne McCord. The Directors whose terms are expiring are Bud Birkenseer, John Hickson, Christine Stafford and Ed Walker.

Here also is a review of the proposed changes to the Constitution and By-laws of the Palo Alto LBC.

The purpose of the proposed changes is to facilitate the recruitment of Board members, to help ensure a quorum at Board meetings and to facilitate decision making, by having an odd number of decision makers.

The proposal is to reduce the size of the Board of Directors of the Palo Alto Lawn Bowls Club from 10 members to nine members by reducing the number of Directors from six Directors to five Directors and to reduce the quorum at Directors meetings from six Board members to five Board members.

The proposed changes would require the following amendments:

- 1. Changing Constitution Article V A., from, "...six (6) directors..." to, "...five (5) directors"
- 2. Changing By-laws Article I. Director, from, "All Directors, normally six (6)..." to, "All Directors, normally five (5)..."
- 3. Changing By-laws Article II. Office Tenure, from, "Three Directors shall be elected each year..." to, "Directors shall be elected each year to fill vacancies on the board for the coming year for terms of one or two years, as appropriate..."
- 4. Changing By-laws Article IV. Board of Directors' Meetings from "...A quorum of six voting members of the Board is required." to, "...A quorum of five voting members of the Board is required."

We hope to see you all on the 14th.

### **Delivery Routine**

Do you follow a routine when stepping up to the mat to make your delivery? While we are bowling during our winter months, I strongly recommend that we all, and new and less experienced bowlers in particular, follow these steps to develop or improve our delivery routines.

Basically, a routine is a set number of steps that you do consistently before actually delivering the bowl.

- 1. Step on the mat, take a deep breath to relax your mind and body.
- 2. First, decide on the delivery—forehand or backhand—then set your static foot (the right foot for right handers) in the same position on the mat every time, then angle it so that it follows your chosen aiming line.
- 3. Check your bias. This should help you avoid those annoying wrong bias deliveries!
- 4. Now, as you are about to make the delivery, relax your arm, and visualize in your mind the shot you are about to make. With a smooth fluent swing, release the bowl, allowing your arm to follow through on the delivery line with your palm facing upwards.

Newer bowlers will find it needs real concentration.
